## Tour de Ski and Nordic Combined World Cup

### 2022 Val di Fiemme

#### GUIDELINES FOR SPECTATORS

The **outbreak of the Covid-19 Pandemic** has been affecting all our lives for almost two years, and the whole world of sport has been strongly influenced by this health worldwide emergency, that all the organisers of sport events still have to face with proper and specific rules. Because of the development of the Coronavirus infection all over the world during the year 2020 and 2021, **many Covid-19 related restrictions** established by the **OC Fiemme World Cup for last season will still remain valid for the season 2021/2022, for all the stakeholders involved in the event.**

Guests and **spectators of the Tour de Ski and the Nordic Combined World Cup competitions in Val di Fiemme on January 2022 will be allowed** to enter the competitions' venues, but in order to minimize the risk of infection there will be very careful controls.

In full compliance with national and local rules, **only spectators and guests with a valid Digital Green Certificate / Green pass** will have the right to enter the competitions' venues. According to the latest ordinance issued on November 26<sup>th</sup> 2021 by the Italian Ministry of Health, the Green Pass in Italy can be released to **people who completed the vaccination cycle** against Covid-19 (validity: 9 months) or to **people who recovered from Covid-19** (validity: 6 months).

Alternatively, one of the following documents will be considered equivalent of the Italian Green Pass and can be presented in order to enter both the Cross Country and Ski Jumping Stadium:

- **an Anti-COVID-19 vaccination certificate** recognised by the European Medicines Agency (EMA) or issued by a competent health authority
- a medical **certificate** issued by competent health authorities **confirming recovery from COVID** within the previous 6 months

**Please be aware that according to the above-mentioned Italian Government ordinance, a negative result of a molecular PCR or rapid antigen test won't be considered a valid document to have access to the event.**

*Certificates are accepted in Italian, English, or German and can be both digital or in paper copy.*

You will be asked to show your Green Pass or one of the equivalent documents at the entrance of both the Cross-Country Stadium in Lago di Tesero and the Ski Jumping Stadium in Predazzo.



## BASIC RULES

Individual responsibility is the most important aspect for the safety of everyone. Everybody must follow the basic hygiene measures, to prevent the spread of Covid-19 infection:

1. **Keep the minimum distance of 1m whenever possible (like established by the Italian Ministry of Health)**
2. **Wear a FFP2 mask always inside and outside**
3. **Wash and disinfect frequently your hands**

Anybody who should show symptoms of Covid-19 during the event must contact the immediately the LOC, informing the staff at the entrance of both stadiums.



## JOURNEY TO VAL DI FIEMME

Do not travel to Val di Fiemme if you have symptoms of Covid-19.

During your stay in Val di Fiemme, please try to avoid any contact with other people outside the competition venue.

*Finally, the OC Fiemme World Cup warmly recommends to everyone to act in a responsible way and to follow strictly all measures and recommendations included in this protocol.*

*For your own safety and the safety of other people it is necessary to follow the instructions given by the OC staff/volunteers and the Covid-19 signage inside the competition venues.*

***The OC reserves the right to withdraw the VIP Tickets to all those people who should not comply with the rules included in the present Protocol.***

***This protocol has been defined according to the regulations updated on November 26<sup>th</sup>, 2021 and the OC reserves the right to make any necessary change if some new rules, regarding Covid-19, will be released by the national or local authorities.***
